## International Decade of Indigenous Languages



K'awat'si - A traditional Kwak'wala name gifted by Elders, meaning the traditional painted bentwood box, an enduring symbol of our community's treasured heritage.

Also found in our KEDC Logo is the Sisutle, a powerful crest in Kwakwaka'wakw mythology, embodying protection and strength. This logo is not just an emblem; it is a narrative of our history, values and the unyielding spirit of the Gwa'sala -'Nakwaxda'wx Nations.

# Kwak'wala

In the heart of Port Hardy and surrounding communities, the Kwakwaka'wakw peoples are bringing back an ancient voice—Kwak'wala,

one of the most endangered yet richly expressive Indigenous languages in British Columbia.

#### First Peoples' Cultural Council

One of the most successful tools for learning Kwak'wala is the Mentor - Apprentice Program, supported by the First Peoples' Cultural Council, which connects fluent speakers with learners in immersive, day-to-day environments. Children are also engaging through language camps, digital apps, and signage projects that bring Indigenous words and names back into public spaces.

KEDC Kwa'wala Names

- Our hotel named Kwa'lilas is a Kwak'wala word used by Gwa'sala-'Nakwaxda'xw people meaning 'a place to sleep.'
- Our pub named Nax'id' translates into 'to drink' in Kwak'wala.
- And our fine dining restaurant named Ha'me' means 'to eat' or simply 'food.'
